

Petition to the GLA Board of Directors to call for a Special Meeting

We the undersigned members of the Glastonbury Landowners Association (GLA) are petitioning the GLA Board of Directors (BOD) to call a Special Meeting of the members for the purpose of organizing an Annual Meeting and election. The GLA has not had an Annual Meeting or election since the Nov. 2019 Annual Meeting and election. This is done in direct violation of the Bylaws - ARTICLE V B., which require the association to have an Annual Meeting and election. This situation came about as a result of two opposing factions on the BOD disagreeing on certain nominees being on the ballot.

Furthermore, three current Board members and two former Board members and spouses, totaling eight plaintiffs, filed a lawsuit in the Park County 6th district Court against the GLA to dissolve the corporation on the grounds that the GLA is dysfunctional. As a result, the entire operation of the GLA is now solely in the hands of Judge Brenda Gilbert and functions under her directives.

GLA Bylaws - ARTICLE V C. gives landowners the power to call a Special Meeting to decide upon issues the Board is unable to resolve and to redress grievances, which grievances would include not having the legally required Annual Landowners Meeting and election of directors. A Special Meeting should have been called by the BOD rather than Board members filing suit.

A copy of this petition will be sent to Judge Gilbert with a request that she direct the GLA BOD to call for the Special Meeting, which is what is needed in order to heal the infractions. GLA governance should be in the hands of the members and does not need to be in the hands of the Court, which ought to be the place of last resort.
