BRIEF REGARDING STATUS REPORT

COMES NOW, the undersigned, and provides the following brief to the Court regarding the Status Report and subsequent Order of this Court:

At the time the undersigned was retained, Glastonbury Landowners Association, Inc. ("GLA"), was made up of board members that authorized the undersigned to advance positions on behalf of GLA in response to the case presented by the Petitioners in this matter. On March 8, 2022, Wm. Nels Swandal was appointed by the Court as *Custodian Pendente Lite*. On September 6, 2022, Mr. Swandal provided his Status Report to the Court.

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In the Status Report, Mr. Swandal provides that an election was held for the establishment of a new board. Twelve new board members were elected (six on the South and six on the North). Additionally, a vote was held on the issue of whether to separate North and South Glastonbury into two separate homeowners' associations. Mr. Swandal identifies that an ambiguity exists in the language of the Bylaws and Covenants of the GLA as to the issue of whether there was the requisite number of votes necessary to amend the Covenants. On this front, Mr. Swandal invited respective counsel to file briefing as to this ambiguity.

On September 12, 2022, this Court issued an Order Allowing Briefing to allow the parties to file briefing regarding the matter raised in the Status Report.

At this time, the undersigned is unable to advance a position (either for or against separation) on behalf of the GLA as he has not been provided any directive from the newly elected board. The same is true with respect to the briefing filed by the Petitioners, i.e., the GLA as the Respondents in this action, may agree or disagree with the positions advanced by the Petitioners.

Out of an abundance of caution, and in the hopes that finality can be brought to these longstanding disputes, the undersigned respectfully requests that the Court allow an additional 30 days for the new board to meet and vote as to whether the GLA desires that the undersigned submit briefing on the issue raised in the Status Report and/or the positions

advanced by the Petitioners in their briefing. The undersigned further believes it necessary that the Petitioners, three of which are on the newly elected North GLA Board, be recused from any such vote.

In summation, the undersigned is in an awkward position as the counsel of record of the GLA that is now comprised of new leadership which may not have the same objectives as the previous board. Thus, the undersigned is respectfully requesting that an additional 30 days be provided to the GLA to allow for a formal meeting and vote to be held as to any briefing the GLA wishes to advance – if any.
